

I got this book (Kindle edition) after watching the BBC series -- which I highly recommend (though it seems to be available only on YouTube in sub-optimal quality in the US). The series is wonderful, because Rick Stein clearly loves and appreciates India's food and culture. Since I bought the book, I have made several of the recipes, and they are excellent. I travel to India regularly, and based on

that, I find the recipes are authentic and cover the breadth of India's cuisine well.A few tips, particularly for U.S. customers. The recipes are in metric, so you will need to find or acquire metric measuring cups and spoons. Some ingredients cannot be bought at your average supermarket. If you have a local Indian grocery, you can get most of the staples -- such as spices, ghee, and garlic/ginger paste -- on an initial trip, then you will not have to supplement too often. In the San Francisco bay area finding a grocery store was not a problem. I have never found whole Kasmiri chiles, but cayenne is a good substitute, though perhaps a bit too hot. I highly recommend getting whole spices and using a spice grinder to grind them fresh each time. I bought a Cuisinart spice grinder that is great, and not expensive. You can use a coffee grinder in a pinch. But do try this, because it is well worth it, and not expensive or difficult to do. The book is heavy on seafood, and this should not be a surprise, because that is Stein's specialty. But I am not the world's biggest seafood fan, so my favorites so far are the Chicken Korma and the Saag Paneer. (The Calcutta Egg Curry is also very good.) The Chicken Korma is probably the best recipe I have ever made at home. The Saag Paneer is now one of my staple recipes; it is quick and easy to make, and delicious.
