I am a Montessori teacher. I purchased this book to read to my preschool classroom (ages 3-6) as part of a unit about eyes and to prepare them for a visit from a local optometrist. The class really enjoyed the book. They found it entertaining and highly interesting. I read a previous review which described the book as boring, but I thought it was very well written and very interesting to the children. I appreciated the explanations and level of detail it provided. The book goes into detail about the equipment and steps used in an optometric examination (it specifically discusses and explains Snellen Charts, Autorefractors, the Phoropter, etc). It is one of the very best books on optometry and eyes for children in this age group (the only one that even comes close, in my opinion, is the out of print Take Care Of Your Eyes (Rookie Read-About Health)Rookie Books Take Care of Your Eyes). I would think it would be a great book to read to children before their first eye exam, and a book every optometrist in American would want in their book corner.
